

What would make KSC meetings more effective, or enable/encourage you to attend?

- Most significant issue was conflicts lending to being unavailable, These include but are not limited to:
 - Work
 - · Children Schedules (ex. Activities, Family Dinner, Bedtime, etc)
 - · Most feedback points to meetings 8 PM or later (though that is a moving target request)
- Lack of preparation and/or no agenda/reference notes for review to provide context for meeting
 - Provide Agenda and access to monthly meeting notes / recaps with any supporting material (as available)
 - · More streamlined email/update communication process. So, fewer and more targeted correspondence
 - · Email reminder on the day of.
- Transparency
 - · Looking for a welcoming, non-judgemental, Inclusive, diverse space.
 - Better connection and guidelines for parents not associated to the executive community to listen, share and contribute to the process that happens outside the meetings.
 - · Possibility to contribute and possibly vote on council / parent tabled items ONLINE.

They always conflict with my work schedule, im off work usually on Fridays Continue with zoom meetings

- -Holding them at a variety of times (e.g., 6:30 one month, then 7:00 the next, etc.)
- -An agenda should be sent around a week in advance
- -An email reminder that day

Change in times, after 8:00.


I will attend the meetings.

At the time, it was hard to know how attending was helping since I wasn't on the executive. I liked feeling informed, but there was no action beyond that. It would be helpful to know how parents can actually contribute without being on the executive and how to be connected to the decision-making process that seems to happen outside the meetings.

Just keep spreading the word. If you're not a stay-at-home parent and/or visible in the schoolyard often - it's still easy to miss information, or think that KSC is executive only.



- Email/Newletter at regular intervals but consolidate content with proper naming to help participants focus on the important info.
 - As per above including but not limited to: meeting minutes, process, decisions, etc. detailed captured and relayed as part of previous
- Quarterly cadence for surveys to capture top of mind and allow for more dynamic exchange of ideas in more timely fashion with the ever-changing landscape
- Use other types of Comm tools for more timely exchange. Facebook, Twitter, Dischord and other delivery types (VODs, eNewsletter, etc). Include content from the school itself!?? Maybe teacher / class spotlight per month, etc.
- An emailed newsletter that features content from inside the school. As parents, we miss that connection. Feature at least one classroom an issue. Ask one teacher per issue to write a paragraph on one project they are doing and supply photos. Great opportunity for them to brag about the wonderful work they do and parents get a look inside.
- The meeting minutes need to be complete and capture all that was said. Parents who can't attend rely on them to find out what was said.

Email communication should be automatic and if parents are not interested in receiving the information, they need to unsubscribe from the mailing list. Quarterly/regular surveys to parents of what they would like to cover Happy to complete frequent short (2-3min) surveys like this one.

No, emails have been great.

A sense for the communication available would be helpful (ie expect to receive an email from us once a month and check out our _____ for updates) video messaging, easier and more engaging to view messages from the council I have appreciated that current communications are concise and to the point, I also appreciate it when there are fewer emails/notifications so that I don't feel overwhelmed.



I feel that improving the track and field should be a major focus over the next few years, with a strategy and fundraising plan. It's very expensive but if the community (both that do and don't have kids that attend) sees the value add for them, it's achievable. Right now, the community doesn't utilize the field on nights/weekends and improving it would be valuable for the school and create a community hub. School/classroom supplies, subsidize cost of field trips, musical instruments, sports equipment.

You may want to request folks prioritize the list above. Other areas for support might include: nutrition program; field trips; general classroom enhancements/supplies Special programs like field trips (ie: Science Centre), outdoor education/nature, learning OUTSIDE the classroom.
