

- Make a care kit for the homeless with items such as socks, deodorant, mittens and snacks. Give them out yourself or donate them directly to your local shelter or drop-in.






# **UPCOMING**

**Learning Recovery** - As part of the TDSB's Learning Recovery Plan, they recognize the need for educators, students and parents to address the "unfinished learning" students may have experienced, particularly through the pandemic.
